What Does Muntham House School Community Do?

Muntham House School has a local, regional, national and international reputation for innovative practice, successful outcomes for young people and training professionals in managing challenging behaviour. Our mission is to provide a **safe happy and caring environment** within which young people create new behaviours which help them go forward successfully in to their community.

Muntham House School was recognised as a Specialist Special School in 2006 and received the prestigious Investors in Careers award in 2008 and 2011. In partnership with the British Council it has pioneered curriculum projects with schools in East Africa in particular Kenya and Uganda. For our work in global curriculum projects Muntham was awarded runner up prize in the International Schools award in 2011.

Muntham House School was a founder member of the National Association of Special Schools (NASS) and Engage in their Future organisations, which facilitate peer-to-peer and school collaboration in furthering the educational support offered to young people with special needs and disabilities. - Individual and Group Counselling & Therapy including Art, Music, Play, Drama, Group Counselling, Cognitive Behaviour, Horsemanship and Equine therapy.
- Family Support including general advice on SEND issues, Assessment for Social Care, Family Therapy, Crisis intervention, Bereavement counselling, Reparative Nurturing Groups and Boxall profiling.
- For Schools and Services; Outreach support, Training on Social and Emotional disabilities, including ADHD and aspects of autism in particular Asperger's Syndrome, Curriculum development and Activities for those with Challenging Behaviour.
- Induction, for newly qualified teachers, Governors and support staff, CPD for public services in behaviour management.
- Alternative Curriculum courses in Construction (including Basic Skills Training and Group Therapy).

How are decisions made about who can use the services Muntham House School provides?

Muntham has a calendar of training events for Parents and Carers, Young people, Schools, Local Authorities and Public and Voluntary or Independent Services. If the issue is about placing your son at the school, Muntham House will only consider young people who are referred through your local authority, however we are happy to meet with you at Muntham, prior to you working with your local authority about placing your son at Muntham House.

How does Muntham House communicate with service users and how are they involved in decision making/planning?

- All young people admitted to the school are supported through a Statement of Special Educational Needs or an Education Health and Care plan, which is regularly reviewed by all stakeholders in the plan.

- All programmes of support and training are reviewed through a service level agreement drawn up in partnership with service users to identify specific outcomes

What training are the staff supporting children and young people with SEND had or are having?

- All staff are fully trained with a full year induction at Muntham House School
- Muntham House also offers 21 days of training to staff to maintain their credential and relevance in their areas of expertise.
- Currently Care staff are all qualified at least to N.V.Q. Level 3 in Child Care, although many have Graduate Qualifications in Psychology, Sociology or Education
- All teaching staff are Graduates most with post graduate qualifications in Special Educational Needs
- All of our therapy department and associates are highly experienced and qualified practitioners
